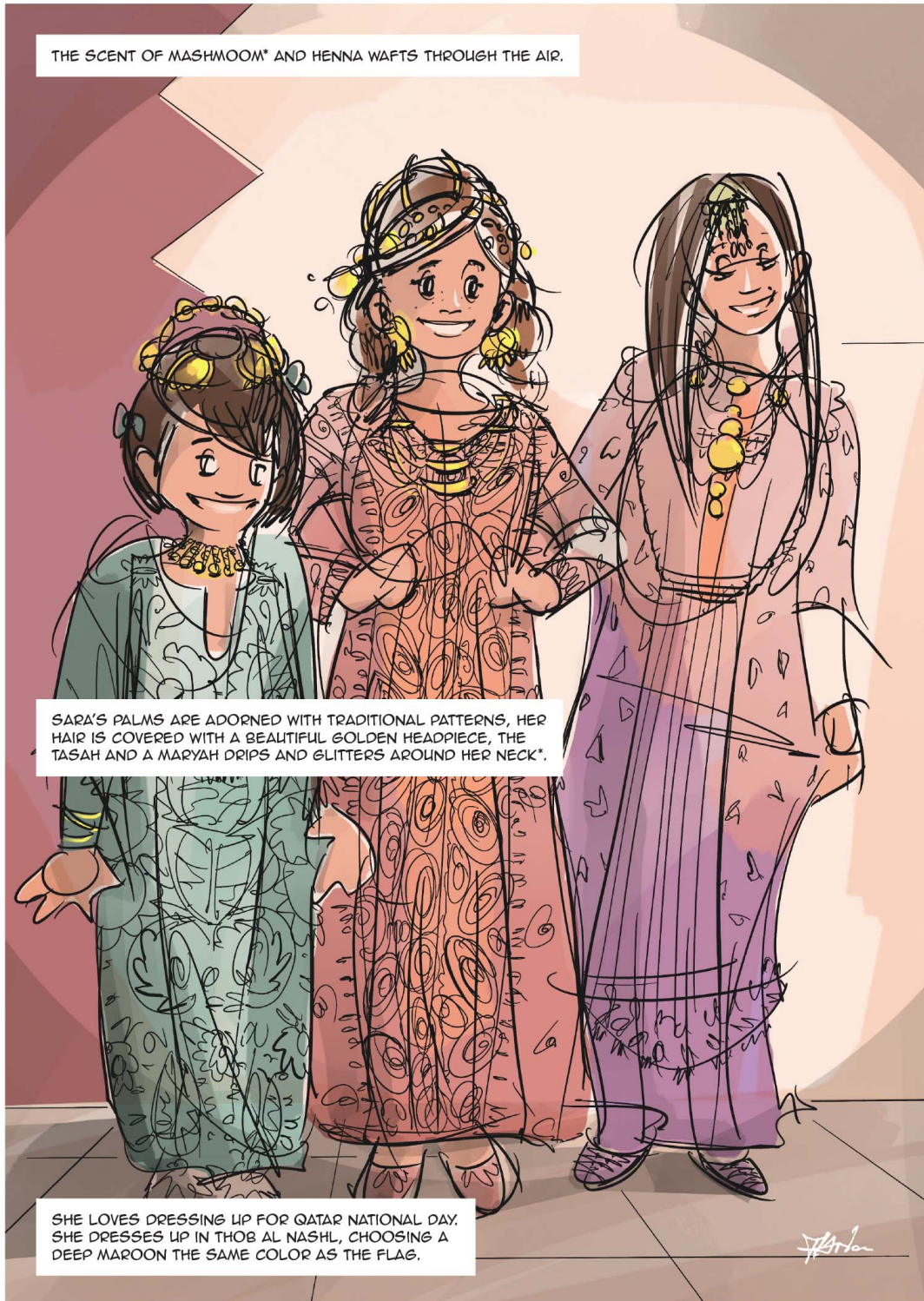




YA OMRY QATAR
